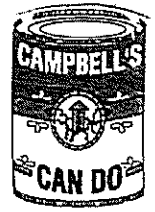

RESOLUTION NO. 15-2

WHEREAS, the Village of Campbell, Nebraska, recognizes that a properly functioning public water supply system is necessary to the health and welfare of the citizens of Village; and

WHEREAS, the Chairman and Village Board have determined that portions of the Village public water supply system are in need of significant repair and improvement; and

WHEREAS, funding for the cost of the Preliminary Engineering Report and/or other eligible planning grant activities of the Village public water supply system may be obtained by grant from the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality, subject to certain requirements and obligations;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Chairman and Village Board of the Village of Campbell, Nebraska, that they should make application for grant between the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality through the Nebraska Environmental Partnerships; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Steve Skupa, Chairman, is hereby directed to execute the application and all other documents necessary to facilitate the grant between the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality to the Village of Campbell, Nebraska, for the purpose of planning for the repairing and improving the Village public water supply system; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Jeanie Schmidt, Clerk, be authorized and directed to sign the payment or outlay request forms, sign all necessary documents to furnish such assurances to the State of Nebraska as may be required by law or regulations, and to receive payment on behalf of the applicant.

Said motion was seconded by L'Heureux. Roll call: aye - L'Heureux, Pearson, Skupa; nay - 0.

The Chairman then declared the motion passed and adopted.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Pearson to accept the contract with JEO Consulting Group as part of the grant process for the test well. Roll call: aye - 3, nay - 0.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by L'Heureux to approve the Fire Department's request to use the tree dump area for mud drags on Saturday, June 13, 2015. Roll call: aye - 3, nay - 0.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Pearson to appoint Henry Schenker as the registered agent for the Campbell Municipal Facilities Corporation. Roll call: aye - 3, nay - 0.

The following action item was tabled until next meeting:

1. Discuss raising the utility reconnect fee (currently \$25)

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:21 p.m. to the call of the Chair.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by L'Heureux to approve the claims and warrants to be drawn for same. Roll call: aye - 3, nay - 0.

Ron Pankoke gave an oral report on village maintenance issues.

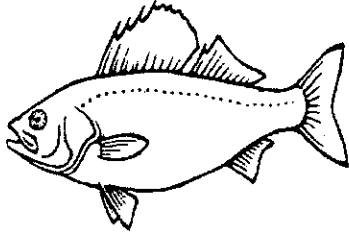
Jeanie Schmidt presented a written report on the status of Mid Rivers 911.

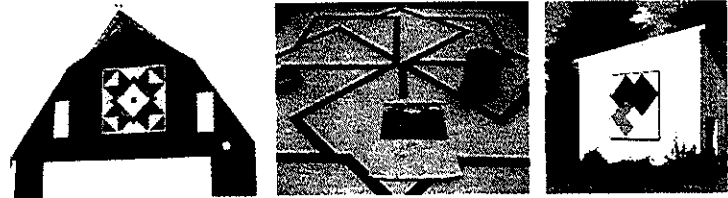

Nebraska Extension—Webster County

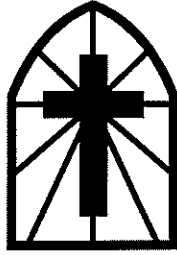


Would you like to make a Barn Quilt? A *Barn Quilt Workshop* will be offered at the Webster County Fairgrounds in **BLADEN, NE** on **Thursday, March 19th** beginning at 5:00 p.m. (or as soon as you can get there after work) until 8:30 p.m. Workshop participants will choose their design and begin painting on Thursday evening, and then meet again on **Friday, March 20th** to finish the project.

The charge is \$30 for a 2X2 foot or \$37.50 for a 4X4 foot Barn Quilt. Registration deadline is **Thursday, March 5th** so the wood can be ordered, cut & primed. You must tell us the size you want to make. (Note 4X4 may not fit into car—may need truck to transport.)
