FEBRUARY IS AMERICAN HEART MONTH

According to the American heart Association, cardiovascular diseases including stroke are our nation's number one killer. Since 1963 Congress has required the President to declare February America Heart Month. This is done in an effort to raise awareness and urge people to join in the fight against these diseases. Each day more than 95 percent of Americans who suffer sudden cardiac arrest die before reaching the hospital. By knowing what to do in an emergency situation, we can give these victims a second chance in life.

What is heart disease?

Coronary heart disease is the most common form of heart disease. Usually referred to simply as heart disease, it is a disorder of the blood vessels of the heart that can lead to a heart attack. A heart attack happens when an artery becomes blocked, preventing oxygen and nutrients from getting to the heart. It is important to realize that heart disease is a lifelong condition—once you get it, you'll always have it. What's more, the condition of your blood vessels will steadily worsen unless you make changes in your daily habits. That's why it is so vital to take action now to prevent this disease.

What are the risk factors for heart disease?

The risk factors for heart disease include: high blood pressure, high blood cholesterol, diabetes, smoking, being overweight, being physically inactive, having a family history of early heart disease, and age (55 or older for women).

Heart disease is the #1 killer of women. One in four American women die of heart disease and most fail to make the connection between risk factors.

Recognize the Symptoms

The list below shows some basic differences between symptoms of a heart attack and heartburn. It is not intended to take the place of a visit to, or discussion with, a qualified health professional. Furthermore, not all heart attacks occur with the same symptoms, and not all of the symptoms below have to be present.

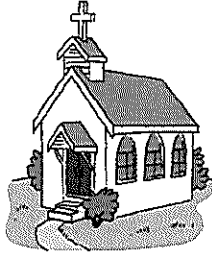
Heart Attack

- Crushing pressure or pain in the chest
- Feeling of fullness in the chest
- Usually occurs with exercise or exertion
- Pain may move to shoulders, back, neck, arms, and jaw
- Irregular heart rate (pulse) may occur
- Shortness of breath
- Cold sweats
- Nausea
- Vomiting
- Lightheadedness, weakness or dizziness

Heartburn

- Burning, irritation below breastbone
- Pain usually does not move to back, shoulders, neck, arms, and jaw
- Usually occurs after meals
- Gets worse when lying down
- Antacids will often make the pain go away
- Rarely cause shortness of breath, lightheadedness, dizziness, or cold sweats
