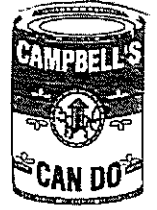

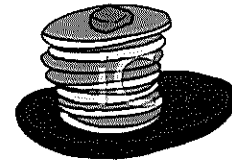

**CAMPBELL VILLAGE BOARD
SPECIAL MEETING
MONDAY, JANUARY 25, 2016**

A Special Meeting of the Village of Campbell Board of Trustees was held in the Community Hall on Monday, January 25, 2016, with Chairman Steve Skupa and Trustees Rodney Lang, Greg L'Heureux, Bill Pearson and Nelson Trambly present. Absent: none. Jeanie Schmidt and Michelle Plock were also present.

Chairman Skupa called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Notice of the meeting was posted in three public places in the Village. The Nebraska Open Meeting Act is posted on the south wall of the Community Hall.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said in unison.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss property assessment amount on demolished property and discuss improvements of Grandview Manor.

A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by Lang to assess expenses in the amount of \$22,622.37 against the demolished property at 173 W Doyle St. Roll call: aye – Lang, L'Heureux, Pearson, Skupa, Trambly; nay - 0.

Michelle Plock presented information on possible plans for the remodeling of Grandview Manor.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Trambly to enter into a negotiation agreement with Michelle Plock and Jim Cooke for the transfer of property to them to make Grandview Manor into an assisted living facility. Roll call: aye – Lang, L'Heureux, Pearson, Skupa, Trambly; nay - 0.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:25 a.m. to the call of the chair.

1. Revise building permit application to include inspection of building after building in place.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:44 a.m. to the call of the Co-chair.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 2016**

A public hearing was held at 10:00 a.m. in the Community Hall with Trustees Rodney Lang, Greg L'Heureux, Bill Pearson and Nelson Trambly present. Absent: Steve Skupa (excused). Jeanie Schmidt, Ron Pankoke, Tom Krueger, Chet Hart and Don McGinnis were also present.

Co-chairman Pearson announced that "it is now 10:00 a.m. and the advertised time for a public hearing on the one (1) and six (6) year street improvement program for the Village of Campbell."

The Co-chairman presented the Affidavit of Publications showing that proper notice had been published.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said in unison.

Tom Krueger, with JEO Consulting Group, presented information on plans for street maintenance work and improvements planned for the coming years.

The following resolution was introduced by Trambly, who moved its adoption, seconded by L'Heureux,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Co-Chairperson and Village Board of Trustees of Campbell, Nebraska, that the plans and data as furnished are hereby in all things accepted and adopted."

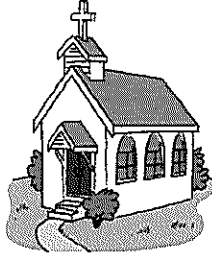
