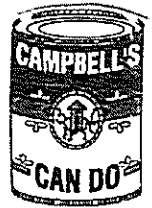

SEVERE WEATHER SAFETY TIPS:

Nebraskans live with the threat of severe weather year round. Nebraska Severe Weather Awareness Week, March 24-28, is a great time to prepare for severe weather. Families should practice their severe weather safety plan at home, work, school, or other public locations that they

frequent. Everyone should know where to go should severe weather strike his or her location.

Tornadoes are one threat from thunderstorms that we need to be ready for, but there are other hazards that accompany storms. Large hail, damaging winds, and dangerous lightning accompany some of the storms that rumble across Nebraska. Your actions before and during severe weather may save lives.

Watch vs. Warning

A *tornado watch* means conditions are favorable for a tornado in our area.

- Remain alert for approaching storms
- Listen to local radio or TV for updates
- Be prepared to move to shelter

A *tornado warning* means a tornado has been sighted or is indicated by weather radar.

If you're indoors

- Go immediately to the shelter areas
- Stay away from windows and glass
- Stay in the shelter area until the storm has passed and are advised that it is safe to leave.

If you're outside

- If possible, get inside a building at once
- If you can't get to a shelter find a ditch or low-lying area, apply your hands to cover your head
- Be aware of the potential for flying debris and flooding, and stay away from glass, small buildings, and fencing

If you are in a vehicle, get out and into a building, or, if there is time, lie in a ditch or other low-lying area.

Campbell Storm Siren Information

- The Campbell storm sirens are located in the city park and are tested the first Saturday of each month at approximately 10:00 A.M. If the siren is activated at any other time and the weather looks stormy (even if it is at midnight) it is signaling that cloud rotation has been spotted and you should take the necessary measures to protect yourselves. Seek shelter immediately in a basement or an interior area without windows, such as a bathroom or closet.

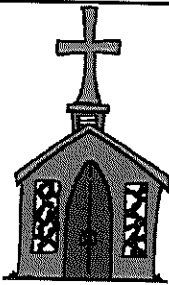
