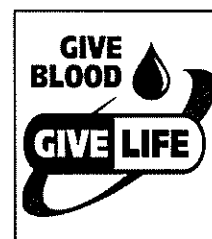
CAMPBELL AREA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE NOTICE

The Campbell Area Chamber of Commerce was cancelled on June 21, 2016, due to poor reported attendance.

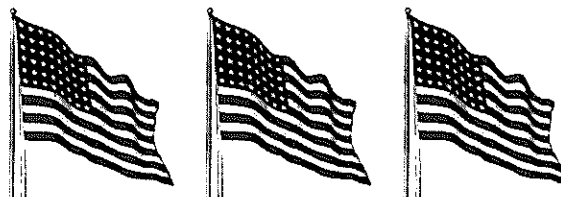
MUD DRAGS

A motion was made by L'Heureux and seconded by Pearson to approve Ordinance 16-1 pertaining to building permits and penalties. Roll call: aye - 3, nay - 0.

ORDINANCE NO. 16-1

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CAMPBELL, NEBRASKA, PERTAINING TO BUILDING PERMITS; TO REVISE VARIOUS PROVISIONS CONCERNING BUILDING PERMITS; TO PROVIDE FOR EXPIRATION AND REINSTATEMENT OF BUILDING PERMITS; TO PROVIDE A PENALTY FOR WORK PERFORMED WITHOUT OR UNDER AN EXPIRED BUILDING PERMIT; TO AMEND SECTIONS 9-101 AND 9-501 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE; TO ADD SECTIONS 9-103 AND 9-104 TO THE MUNICIPAL CODE; TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM; AND TO DECLARE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAMPBELL, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Section 9-101 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Campbell, Nebraska, is hereby amended to read as follows:

S9-101 BUILDING PERMITS.

Any person, firm, or corporation desiring to erect, construct, enlarge, alter, move, remove, convert, or demolish any building or structure in the Village, or cause the same to be done, shall file with the Municipal Clerk an application for a building permit. The application shall be in writing on a form to be furnished by the Municipal Clerk for that purpose. Every such application shall set forth the legal description of the land upon which the construction or relocation is to take place, the nature of the use or occupancy, the principal dimensions, the estimated cost, the names of the owner, architect, and contractor, and such other information as may be requested thereon. The application, plans, and specifications so filed with the Municipal Clerk shall be checked and examined by the Governing Body and, if they are found to be in conformity with the requirements of this Chapter and all other ordinances applicable thereto, the Governing Body shall authorize the Municipal Clerk to issue the said applicant a permit upon the payment of the permit fee of twenty dollars (\$20.00). Whenever there is a discrepancy between permit application procedures contained in this Chapter and those contained in any building code adopted by reference, the provisions contained in this Chapter shall govern.

Section 2. That Section 9-103 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Campbell, Nebraska, is hereby added to read as follows:

S9-103 BUILDING PERMITS; EXPIRATION AND REINSTATEMENT OF PERMIT.

Every permit issued shall become invalid unless the work on the site authorized by such permit is commenced within 180 days after its issuance, if the work authorized on the site by such permit is not completed within 1 year after its issuance, or if the work authorized on the site by such permit is commenced. The Governing Body is authorized to grant one or more extensions for periods not more than 180 days each. The extension shall be requested in writing and justifiable cause demonstrated. In the event a permit expires without the work therein completed, the permit may be reinstated only upon the written application of the original applicant pursuant to the provisions of section 9-101 herein and further explaining in writing the reason or reasons why the permit should be reinstated. The Governing Body is in no way required to grant a reinstatement, even if the request is timely made. The fee for a reinstatement, if granted, is twenty dollars (\$20.00).

Section 3. That Section 9-104 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Campbell, Nebraska, is hereby added to read as follows:

S9-104 BUILDING PERMITS; VIOLATION AND PENALTIES.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to erect, construct, enlarge, alter, move, remove, convert, or demolish any building or structure in the Village, or cause the same to be done without having first obtained a building permit as provided in this code or if said building permit has expired and neither been extended nor reinstated. Any person, firm, or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this Article shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Each day that such violation is committed or permitted to continue shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable as such hereunder.

Buildings or structures that have been partially constructed, but have no building permit to continue construction, shall be deemed to be in violation of this code. Each day that a partially constructed building or structure exists without a building permit constitutes a new violation. The Governing Body shall have the authority to exercise any powers granted under this code to compel completion of a partially constructed building or structure, refer for prosecution of a violation, or seek demolition in accordance with this code and applicable state law.

Section 4. That Section 9-501 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Campbell, Nebraska, is hereby amended to read as follows:

S9-501 VIOLATION; PENALTY.

Any person who shall violate or refuse to comply with the enforcement of any of the provisions of this Chapter unless otherwise provided herein, set forth at full length herein or incorporated by reference shall be deemed guilty of an offense and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each offense. A new violation shall be deemed to have been committed every twenty-four (24) hours of such failure to comply.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form as part of the Municipal Code of the Village of Campbell, Nebraska.

Section 6. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.

PASSED AND APPROVED this 14th day of June, 2016.

The action item for the purchase of a riding mower was dropped.

The action item concerning a building permit for a storage shed on Lot 2, Block 16, Original Town (661 Taylor) was denied due to information on application being too vague.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:51 a.m. to the call of the Chair.

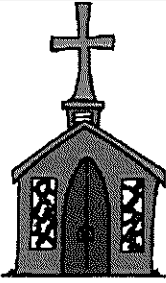
Independence Day of the United States, also referred to as the Fourth of July or July Fourth in the U.S., is a federal holiday commemorating the adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, by the Continental Congress declaring that the thirteen American colonies regarded themselves as a new nation, the United States of America, and no longer part of the British Empire. Independence Day is commonly associated with fireworks, parades, barbecues, carnivals, fairs, picnics, concerts, baseball games, family reunions, and political speeches and ceremonies, in addition to various other public and private events celebrating the history, government, and traditions of the United States. Independence Day is the National Day of the United States.

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the Thirteen Colonies from Great Britain occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia declaring the United States independent from Great Britain rule. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a Committee of Five, with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the wording of the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4.

Historians have long disputed whether Congress actually signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, even though Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and Benjamin Franklin all later wrote that they had signed it on that day. Most historians have concluded that the Declaration was signed nearly a month after its adoption, on August 2, 1776, and not on July 4 as is commonly believed.

Coincidentally, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, the only signers of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as Presidents of the United States, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the Declaration. Although not a signer of the Declaration of Independence, but another Founding Father who became a President, James Monroe, died on July 4, 1831, thus becoming the third President in a row who died on the holiday. Calvin Coolidge, the 30th President, was born on July 4, 1872, and, so far, is the only U.S. President to have been born on Independence Day.
