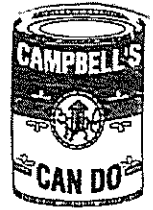

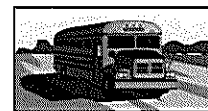

A motion was made by Pearson and seconded by Lang to adopt Resolution 16-1 so as to qualify as a participant in the Quad Counties Hazard Mitigation Plan Update. Roll call: aye - 3, nay - 0.

RESOLUTION NO. 16-1

WHEREAS, the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 was signed in to law on October 30, 2000, placing new emphasis on state and local mitigation planning for natural hazards and requiring communities to adopt a hazard mitigation action plan to be eligible for pre-disaster and post-disaster federal funding for mitigation purposes; and

WHEREAS, a Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan was prepared by Harlan, Franklin, Furnas and Red Willow counties, with assistance from JEO Consulting Group, Inc. of Lincoln, NE, which includes the jurisdiction of Campbell NE.

WHEREAS, the purpose of the mitigation plan was to lessen the effects of disasters by increasing the disaster resistance of the Quad Counties and participating jurisdictions located within the planning boundary by identifying the hazards that affect the jurisdiction of Campbell NE and prioritize mitigation strategies to reduce potential loss of life and property damage from those hazards, and

WHEREAS, FEMA regulations require documentation that the plan has been formally adopted by the governing body of Campbell NE in the form of a resolution and further requesting approval of the plan at the Federal Level; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the governing body of Campbell NE does herewith adopt the Quad Counties Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update in its entirety; and **PASSED AND APPROVED** this 11th day of July, 2016.

The Board discussed the updated information received on the nursing home building with no action taken.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:06 p.m. to the call of the Chair.

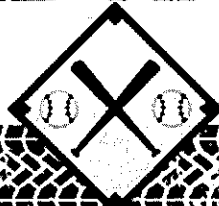

SUN SAFETY

Your summer goal may be to look like a golden god or goddess, but you better build some safe sun habits before you suffer a nasty sunburn and wrinkly skin.

Sunscreen is an invisible cream or lotion that absorbs ultraviolet radiation.

Sunblock, like the name implies, blocks ultraviolet radiation. It's a thick cream containing zinc oxide, which is that white goop.

Both sunscreen and sunblock are labeled with an SPF, which stands for Sun Protection Factor. It ranges from 1 to 60 – the higher the number, the better the protection. Dermatologists recommend at least an SPF of 15, but the level of protection you need all depends on how much time you spend outdoors.

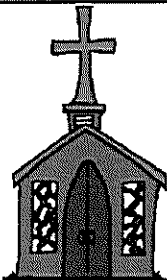
Remember other areas of your body: your ears, behind the knees and the top of the feet. Skin cancer can turn up anywhere, like the hairline and scalp, so massage sunscreen into your roots. Apply a lip balm with SPF 15 on your lips. Choose a pair of sunglasses that blocks all UVA and UVB rays. Exposing your eyes to the sun may result in eye damage, which can lead to vision loss!

Other tips!

1. The sun's rays are strongest between 10AM and 2PM. That doesn't mean you have to stay indoors during these hours, but try playing in the shade instead of out in the direct sunlight. If you are in the sun with no shade, apply any SPF lotion to help prevent sunburns.

2. When you're out in the scorching sun sweating, you lose a lot of body fluids. Drink plenty of water (at least 8 glasses a day) to avoid heat-related illnesses.
