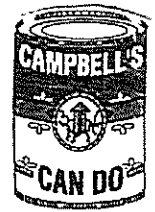

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Pearson to approve the claims and warrants to be drawn for same as funds become available. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0.

A motion was made L'Heureux and seconded by Lang to approve the Treasurer's Report. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0.

Employee payroll, insurance and tax reports were examined.

Ron Pankoke reported on village maintenance issues.

Jeanie Schmidt presented a written report on the status of Mid Rivers 911.

Jeanie Schmidt presented a written report on clerk issues. Our bid of \$500 for Lot Eighteen (18), Block Twelve (12), Original Town of Campbell (the property south of the Power House) was accepted by the Franklin County Supervisors.

Questions and concerns were heard from the public. Complaints were heard concerning building permits. Complaints were also heard concerning nuisance properties with trash and overgrown weeds.

A motion was made by L'Heureux and seconded by Lang to approve the proposed budget for 2016-2017. Roll call: aye - Lang, L'Heureux, Pearson, Skupa; nay - 0. Motion carried.

A motion was made by L'Heureux and seconded by Pearson to approve an additional 1% increase in restricted funds. Roll call: aye - Lang, L'Heureux, Pearson, Skupa; nay - 0. Motion carried.

The Board discussed customers' concerns of charges on their utility bill in which the electrical usage on their bill varied considerably from the previous month. The Board will make a decision on an individual basis at the next meeting when more information is available.

Mike Schultes with JEO Consulting Group presented updated information on the test well project.

Trustee L'Heureux introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION 16-2

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CHAIRPERSON AND THE CLERK TO SIGN ALL DOCUMENTS AS MAY BE REQUIRED IN THE PORCESSING OR COMPLETING THE USDA, SPECIAL EVALUATION ASSISTANCE FOR RURAL COMMUNITY AND HOUSEHOLD PROGRAM (SEARCH) GRANT.

WHEREAS: the Village of Campbell is in the process of applying for a USDA Rural Development Grant to fund a portion of the costs to complete a Preliminary Engineering Report (PER).

WHEREAS: there are certain and various documents which require signatures of the Chairperson and/or the Clerk.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Campbell that the Chairperson and Clerk are hereby authorized to sign all documents as may be required in the processing or completing of the USDA, Rural Development Grant.

If the Chief Elected Official and/or Clerk should change because of an election or other reasons during the processing of the USDA Rural Development/Rural Utilities Service application, the Village Board of Trustees will not need to amend this resolution so the Chairperson and Clerk can sign any form(s) and security instrument(s) to finalize the USDA Rural Development/Rural Utilities Service financial assistance.

Said motion was seconded by Lang. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0. The Chairman then declared the motion passed and adopted.

The following action item was tabled until next meeting:

1. Discuss customer concern of charges on their utility bill

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:51 a.m. to the call of the Chair.

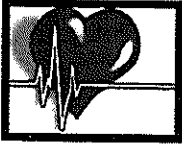

Abdominal Aortic Ultrasound Screening (\$40.00) — this painless, noninvasive screening detects the presence of an aneurysm in the abdominal aorta. (Requires 4 hour fasting)

OCTOBER IS NATIONAL BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Here are some breast cancer facts:

-The American Cancer Society estimates that Breast Cancer accounts for 1 out of every 3 cancers diagnosed in the U.S.

-Breast cancer is the most frequently diagnosed cancer in women.

-More women in the U.S. are living with breast cancer than with any other cancer.

-Approximately 3 million women in the U.S. are living with breast cancer, more than 2 million have been diagnosed with the disease, and an estimated 1 million do not yet know they have the disease.

-Based on the most recent data, relative survival rates for women diagnosed with breast cancer are: 88% at 5 years after diagnosis, 80% after 10 years, 71% after 15 years, and 63% after 20 years.

-Breast cancer is the second leading cause for cancer death for women in the U.S. (after lung cancer) and is the leading cause of cancer death for women worldwide.

-Death rates from breast cancer have decreased. The decline has been attributed to both improvements in breast cancer treatment and early detection.

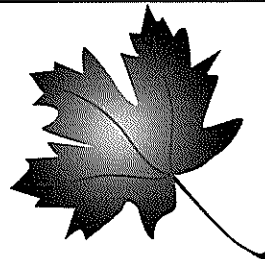
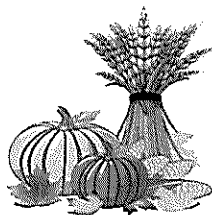

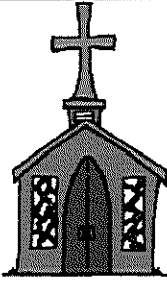
