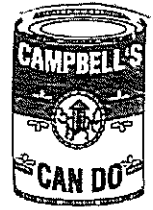

Questions and concerns were heard from the public.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Trambly to credit an overcharge on a customer's utility bill due to the meter malfunctioning, using an average usage for the past year. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0.

A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by L'Heureux to adopt Ordinance 16-2 pertaining to an electrical inspection needed before electrical service will be provided to any house/building that has been vacant for a period of 90 days or more. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0. A complete copy of this ordinance is on file in the clerk's office.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by L'Heureux to transfer the title of Lot 18, Block 12, Original Town to Greg Wardenburg per agreement reached. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0.

(After conferring with our attorney, this transfer was deemed incorrect and the motion was rescinded.)

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:00 a.m. to the call of the Chair.
