### South Route

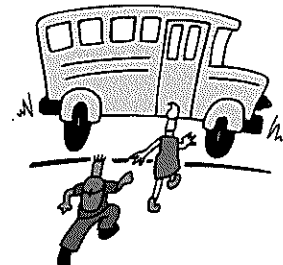
- 1<sup>st</sup> Place: Sydney Meyer

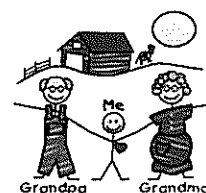

President Jimmy Carter, in 1978, proclaimed that National Grandparents Day would be celebrated every year on the first Sunday after Labor Day. The flower for U.S. National Grandparents Day is the Forget-Me-Not.

## **LABOR DAY**

Labor Day, the first Monday in September, is the creation of the labor movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers. It constitutes a yearly national tribute to the contribution workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country. The idea spread with the growth of the labor unions and in 1885 it was decided to celebrate Labor Day as a national holiday on the first Monday in September.

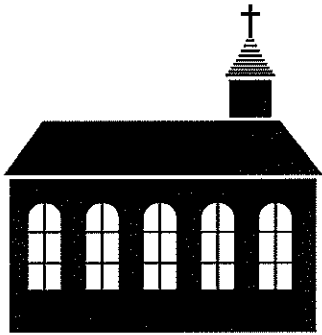
