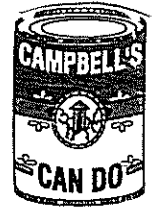

REGULAR MEETING
MONDAY, DECEMBER 11, 2017

The Village of Campbell Board of Trustees held its Regular Meeting in the Community Hall at 6:00 p.m. with Chairman Steve Skupa and Trustees Rodney Lang, Bill Pearson and Nelson Trambly present. Absent: Greg L'Heureux (excused). Jeanie Schmidt, Ron Pankoke, Sam Reinke, Rick Dean, Dana Meyer and Chet Hart were also present.

Chairman Skupa called the meeting to order. Notice of the meeting was posted in three public places in the Village. The Nebraska Open Meeting Act is posted on the south wall of the Community Hall.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said in unison.

A motion was made by Pearson and seconded by Lang to approve the minutes of the previous month's regular meeting. Roll call: aye - 3, nay - 0.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Trambly to excuse L'Heureux as being absent. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0.

Sam Reinke with Southern Power District presented information on their contract. Rick Dean and Dana Meyer were also present to answer any questions about SPD. A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Trambly to approve the contract with Southern Power District for the period of January 1, 2018, to December 31, 2035. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0.

Forming a Workplace Safety Committee was discussed. One member from the Board of Trustees and one member from the Employees will be on the committee.

A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by Lang to approve the change of order for the 2017 Water System Improvements Group A (water meters) because the Village plans to self-install the meters. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0.

A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by Pearson to: 1) retain Skupa as chairman of the board, 2) to appoint members to the same committees as previously held, 3) to add a Safety Committee consisting of Rodney Lang and Ron Pankoke, 4) to appoint Ryan C. Kavan with JEO Consulting Group Inc. as the city street superintendent for 2018, and 5) to appoint JEO Consulting Group Inc. as the village engineer for 2018. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0.

The topic of people parking in their front yard/on the grass instead of in the designated area/driveway was discussed with no action taken.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Lang to approve the building permit for Bill Pearson to add an enclosed room on his house at 356 E Fairview St. Roll call: aye - 4, nay - 0.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:54 p.m. to the call of the Chair.

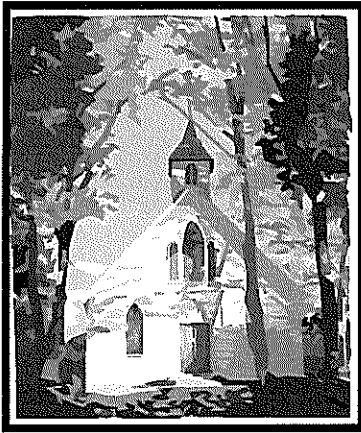
