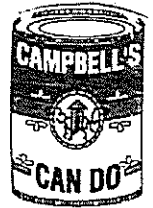

REGULAR MEETING
MONDAY, APRIL 10, 2017

The Village of Campbell Board of Trustees held its Regular Meeting in the Community Hall at 7:30 p.m. with Chairman Steve Skupa and Trustees Rodney Lang, Greg L'Heureux, Bill Pearson and Nelson Trambly present. Absent: none. Jeanie Schmidt, Ron Pankoke, Mike Schultes, Jean Penney, Peg Hart, Pastor Loren Cooper, Richard & Mona Fassler and Chris Smith were also present.

Chairman Skupa called the meeting to order. Notice of the meeting was posted in three public places in the Village. The Nebraska Open Meeting Act is posted on the south wall of the Community Hall.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Pearson to approve the Treasurer's Report. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

Employee payroll, insurance and tax reports were examined. Ron Pankoke gave an oral report on village maintenance issues. Jeanie Schmidt presented a written report on the status of Mid Rivers

Jeanie Schmidt presented a written report on clerk issues.

Questions and concerns were heard from the public.

Mike Schultes with JEO Consulting was present to answer questions on the engineering agreement for the water project. A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by L'Heureux to approve the engineering agreement with JEO Consulting for the water project. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

A motion was made by Pearson and seconded by Lang to adopt Resolution 17-2 authorizing the chairperson and the clerk of the Village of Campbell to execute documents required to receive USDA Rural Development Financial Assistance. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

RESOLUTION 17-2

AUTHORIZING THE CHAIRPERSON AND THE CLERK OF THE VILLAGE OF CAMPBELL, NEBRASKA, TO EXECUTE DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO RECEIVE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE RURAL DEVELOPMENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY:

The Board of Campbell, Nebraska, that the Chairperson and Clerk are authorized and directed to execute any and all documents and security instruments or other memoranda between the Board of Campbell, Nebraska, and the USDA Rural Development so as to effect the Sewer/Water Project application(s) for assistance.

If the Chairperson or the Clerk should change because of an election or other reasons during the processing of the USDA Rural Development application(s), the Board of Campbell, Nebraska, will not need to amend this resolution so the Chairperson and the Clerk can sign any form(s) and security instrument(s) to finalize the USDA Rural Development financial assistance.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Lang to approve the use of Grandview Manor for the Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, April 15, 2017, sponsored by the Campbell Area Foundation. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

The Board discussed hiring summer help for cleaning the bathrooms at the park, ball field, etc. It was decided to expand the duties of Beverly Pankoke to include these jobs.

A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by Lang to adopt Ordinance No. 17-2 pertaining to property owner responsibility for tenant's utilities; to provide joint responsibility for utilities between the property owner and tenant or occupant. Roll call: aye - Lang, L'Heureux, Skupa, Trambly; nay - Pearson.

ORDINANCE NO. 17-2

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CAMPBELL, NEBRASKA, PERTAINING TO PROPERTY OWNER RESPONSIBILITY FOR TENANT'S UTILITIES; TO PROVIDE JOINT RESPONSIBILITY FOR UTILITIES BETWEEN THE PROPERTY OWNER AND TENANT OR OCCUPANT; TO ADD SECTION 3-406 TO THE MUNICIPAL CODE; TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM; AND TO DECLARE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAMPBELL, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Section 3-406 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Campbell, Nebraska, is hereby added to read as follows:

3-406 UTILITIES GENERALLY: RESPONSIBILITY OF LANDLORD AND

TENANT.

In cases of residential, commercial or industrial rental properties, the property owner and the tenant or occupant shall be jointly responsible for payment of bills for utilities. The Village Clerk shall first attempt to collect the bill from the tenant, and if payment is not voluntarily made by the tenant, then the Village Clerk may look to the property owner for payment. The tenant or occupant's service deposit and any other payments shall first be applied to the account before collection of the account balance from the property owner. In case of delinquency, the property owner shall be provided a copy of the notice of delinquency and notice of intent to terminate service required herein. Unpaid accounts for water, sewer, electricity, and solid waste collection services may still be filed as liens against the property as provided herein and the property owner shall be provided copies of all notices required in those Sections. In case of delinquency that falls on the property owner's responsibility to pay after exhausting all attempts to collect from the tenant, the Village has the right to disconnect utility service to that property until such time as all accounts are paid in full pursuant to the Village's ordinance concerning reconnect of delinquent accounts.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form as part of the Municipal Code of the Village of Campbell, Nebraska.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.

PASSED AND APPROVED this 10th day of April, 2017.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:05 p.m. to the call of the Chair.

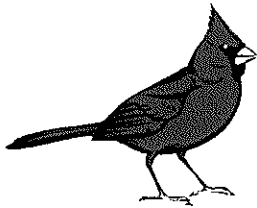
