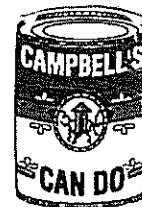

OCTOBER IS NATIONAL BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Here are some breast cancer facts:

- The American Cancer Society estimates that Breast Cancer accounts for 1 out of every 3 cancers diagnosed in the U.S.
 - Breast cancer is the most frequently diagnosed cancer in women.
 - More women in the U.S. are living with breast cancer than with any other cancer.
 - Approximately 3 million women in the U.S. are living with breast cancer, more than 2 million have been diagnosed with the disease, and an estimated 1 million do not yet know they have the disease.
 - Based on the most recent data, relative survival rates for women diagnosed with breast cancer are: 88% at 5 years after diagnosis, 80% after 10 years, 71% after 15 years, and 63% after 20 years.
 - Breast cancer is the second leading cause for cancer death for women in the U.S. (after lung cancer) and is the leading cause of cancer death for women worldwide.
 - Death rates from breast cancer have decreased. The decline has been attributed to both improvements in breast cancer treatment and early detection.

RESOLUTION NO. 17-3

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1601.02 provides that the property tax request for the prior year shall be the property tax request for the current year for purposes of the levy set by the County Board of Equalization unless the Governing Body of the Village of Campbell passes by a majority vote a resolution or ordinance setting the tax request at a different amount; and

WHEREAS, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the Village of Campbell that

the property tax request for the current year be a different amount than the property tax request for the prior year.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Governing Body of the Village of Campbell, by a majority vote, resolves that:

1. The 2017-2018 property tax request be set at \$49,490.00.

2. A copy of this resolution be certified and forwarded to the County Clerk on or before

October 13, 2017.

Passed and approved this 12th day of September, 2017.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by L'Heureux to approve an additional 1% increase in restricted funds. Roll call: aye – L'Heureux, Pearson, Skupa; nay – 0. Motion carried.

Levi Adam with South Central Economic Development presented information on their Nuisance Abatement Program with the most common nuisances in most communities being unlicensed cars; uncontrolled weeds, grass, trees, bushes; houses with broken windows, doors; outbuildings in disrepair.

Sam Reinke and Neal Niedfeldt with Southern Power District visited with the Board about Incentive Programs that are being offered to residential and commercial customers.

Mike Schultes with JEO Consulting Group presented a review of the water meter inventory and possible rates.
