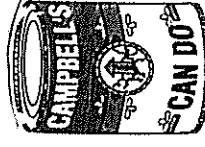

The Village of Campbell Board of Trustees held its Regular Meeting in the Community Hall at 7:30 a.m. with Chairman Steve Skupa and Trustees Rodney Lang, Greg L'Heureux, Bill Pearson and Nelson Trambly present. Absent: none. Jeanie Schmidt, Ron Pankoke and Gary Derr were also present.

Chairman Skupa called the meeting to order. Notice of the meeting was posted in three public places in the Village. The Nebraska Open Meeting Act is posted on the south wall of the Community Hall.

A motion was made by Pearson and seconded by L'Heureux to approve the claims and warrants to be drawn for same. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

A motion was made Lang and seconded by Trambly to approve the Treasurer's Report. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

Employee payroll, insurance and tax reports were examined.

Ron Pankoke reported on village maintenance issues.

Jeanie Schmidt presented a written report on the status of Mid Rivers 911. She reported on the meeting she had attended about Mid Rivers 911 joining the Southeast 911 Region.

Jeanie Schmidt presented a written report on clerk issues. The Board decided: 1) utility customers who were on a cash-only basis due to writing non sufficient fund checks be allowed to issue checks again after a 6-month period; 2) to increase the sewer fund rate and the sinking fund rate for Grandview Manor at the same percentage rate as for other customers.

A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by Skupa to charge \$10/1000 gallons bulk rate for people from out of town. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

The following action items were tabled until the next meeting:

1. Discuss adopting Ordinance 18-2 finalizing the sale of certain real property to Hoffmeister Homes, Inc., etc.

2. Discuss contract with Franklin County Sheriff's Office

3. Discuss wages for village employees

The following action items were tabled until a special meeting with Ameritas and JEO Consulting Group:

1. Discussion and action on resolution paying off the original water bond

2. Discussion and action on ordinance issuing \$700,000 in water bond anticipation notes

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:10 a.m. to the call of the Chair.

OCTOBER IS NATIONAL BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

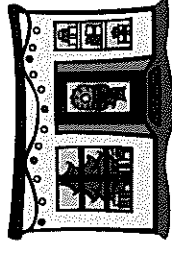
Here are some breast cancer facts:

- The American Cancer Society estimates that Breast Cancer accounts for 1 out of every 3 cancers diagnosed in the U.S.
- Breast cancer is the most frequently diagnosed cancer in women.
- More women in the U.S. are living with breast cancer than with any other cancer.
- Approximately 3 million women in the U.S. are living with breast cancer, more than 2 million have been diagnosed with the disease, and an estimated 1 million do not yet know they have the disease.
- Based on the most recent data, relative survival rates for women diagnosed with breast cancer are: 88% at 5 years after diagnosis, 80% after 10 years, 71% after 15 years, and 63% after 20 years.

-Breast cancer is the second leading cause for cancer death for women in the U.S. (after lung cancer) and is the leading cause of cancer death for women worldwide.

-Death rates from breast cancer have decreased. The decline has been attributed to both improvements in breast cancer treatment and early detection.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTING CONTEST

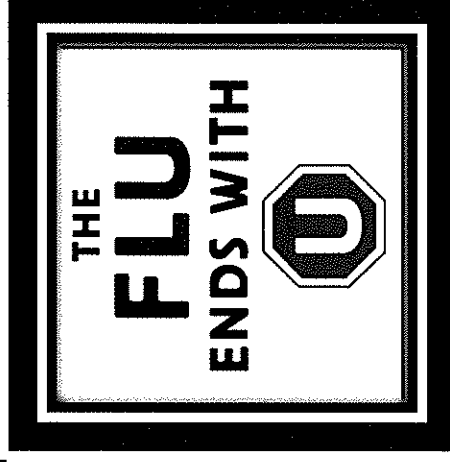

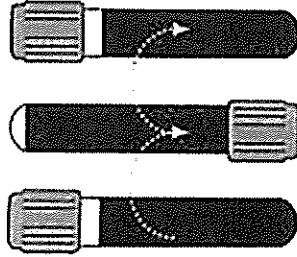

Cardiovascular Screenings

Atrial Fibrillation Screening:

Atrial fibrillation is the most common heart arrhythmia, affecting 2.7 million Americans. Anyone is eligible. Cost: \$10

To be eligible for the following studies you must be at least 65 years old or age 55 with certain personal risk factors or family history. Please discuss your eligibility with the scheduler listed above.

Peripheral Arterial Disease Screening:

A painless, non-invasive test called the ankle-brachial index (ABI) compares the blood pressure in the ankles to the blood pressure in the arms to determine how well blood is flowing. Cost: \$20

Abdominal Aortic Ultrasound Screening:

This painless, non-invasive screening detects the presence of an aneurysm in the abdominal aorta (if he, fast required). Cost: \$40

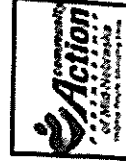
Carotid Artery Ultrasound Screening:

This painless, non-invasive screening detects plaque deposits in the carotid arteries. These plaque deposits are a leading risk factor for stroke. Cost: \$40
