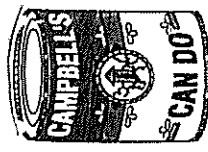

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 11, 2018

The Village of Campbell Board of Trustees held its Regular Meeting in the Community Hall at 7:30 a.m. with Chairman Steve Skupa and Trustees Rodney Lang, Greg L'Heureux, Bill Pearson and Nelson Trambly present. Absent: none. Jeanie Schmidt, Ron Pankoke, Sam Reinke, Dana Meyer and Ryan Kavan were also present.

Chairman Skupa called the meeting to order. Notice of the meeting was posted in three public places in the Village. The Nebraska Open Meeting Act is posted on the south wall of the Community Hall.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Trambly to approve the claims and warrants to be drawn for same and to approve the Treasurer's Report. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by Pearson to approve the contract with Franklin County Sheriff's Office. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

Sam Reinke with Southern Power District, along with Dana Meyer, presented information on the return of funds through Power Cost Adjustment (PCA) and an update on the energy efficiency programs.

Ryan Kavan with JEO Consulting Group gave a review of our one- and six-year street improvement program.

A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by Skupa to approve the building permit for Hall's Oil Inc. for an addition to their Station at 2489 Hwy 4. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Pearson to renew the contract with GIS Workshop. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Trambly to adopt Ordinance 18-3 pertaining to zoning requirements for keeping larger animals; to add a 70 foot setback from a neighboring residence; and said location has to be surveyed by a licensed surveyor. Roll call: aye - Lang, L'Heureux, Pearson, Skupa, Trambly; nay - 0. A complete copy of the ordinance is on file in the clerk's office.

A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by L'Heureux to: 1) retain Skupa as chairman of the board, 2) to appoint members to the same committees as previously held, 3) to appoint Ryan C. Kavan with JEO Consulting Group Inc. as the city street superintendent for 2019, and 4) to appoint JEO Consulting Group Inc. as the village engineer for 2019. Roll call: aye - 5, nay - 0.
