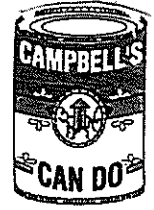

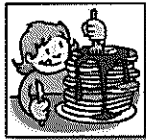

The Village of Campbell Board of Trustees held its Regular Meeting in the Community Hall at 7:30 a.m. with Chairman Steve Skupa and Trustees Rodney Lang, Greg L'Heureux, Bill Pearson and Nelson Trambly present. Absent: none. Jeanie Schmidt, Ron Pankoke, Chet Hart and Gary Derr were also present.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by L'Heureux to approve the claims and warrants to be drawn for same and to approve the Treasurer's Report. Roll call: aye – 5, nay – 0.

Employee payroll, insurance and tax reports were examined.

Ron Pankoke gave an oral report on village maintenance issues. The Board agreed to split the cost with the Fire Department for an asbestos inspection for the house at 742 Taylor St. This house will be used for a house burn training.

Jeanie Schmidt presented a written report on the status of Mid Rivers 911.

Jeanie Schmidt presented a written report on clerk issues. The Board approved the purchase of a new computer for the clerk's office.

A motion was made by Trambly and seconded by Skupa to adopt Ordinance 19-1 pertaining to adding the dog license fee to the utility bill. Roll call: aye – Lang, L'Heureux, Pearson, Skupa, Trambly; nay – 0.

ORDINANCE 19-1

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CAMPBELL, NEBRASKA, PERTAINING TO DOG LICENSES; TO REQUIRE PROOF OF CURRENT RABIES CERTIFICATE BY MAY 15 OR WITHIN 30 DAYS OF ACQUISITION OF DOG IF AFTER MAY 15; TO PROVIDE FOR ASSESSMENT OF LICENSE FEE TO UTILITY BILL; TO AMEND SECTION 6-101 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE; TO PROVIDE FOR PUBLICATION IN PAMPHLET FORM; AND TO DECLARE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAMPBELL, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That Section 6-101 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Campbell, Nebraska, is hereby amended to read as follows:

6-101 DOGS: LICENSE.

Any person who shall own, keep, or harbor a dog over the age of six (6) months within the Municipality shall within thirty (30) days after acquisition of the dog acquire a license for each such dog. Said license shall be renewed annually by or before the fifteenth (15th) day of May of each year from the Municipal Clerk. The owner shall state at the time the application is made and upon printed forms provided for such purpose, his/her name and address and the name, breed, color, and sex of each dog owned and kept by him/her. A certificate that the dog has had a rabies shot, effective for the ensuing year of the license, shall be presented when the license is applied for and no license or tag shall be issued until the certificate is shown. The initial license fee and annual license renewal fee are ten dollars (\$10.00) per dog per year regardless of gender, age, spaying/neutering of said dog and said license fees shall be assessed to the next utility bill for the property where the dog is kept or harbored subsequent to the issuing of the license. The license shall not be transferable and no refund will be allowed in case of death, sale, or other disposition of the licensed dog.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form as part of the Municipal Code of the Village of Campbell, Nebraska.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.

PASSED AND APPROVED this 11th day of March, 2019.

The Board discussed selling 0.34 acres on the north side of the sewer lagoon with no action taken.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by L'Heureux to give a donation of \$300 from the Village of Campbell/Mid Rivers 911 to the Franklin County Memorial Hospital for their fundraiser. Roll call: aye – 5, nay – 0.

1. Discuss adopting Ordinance 18-2 finalizing the sale of certain property to Hoffmeister Homes, Inc., etc

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:12 a.m. to the call of the Chair.



SEVERE WEATHER SAFETY TIPS:

Nebraskans live with the threat of severe weather year round. Nebraska Severe Weather Awareness Week, March 25-29, is a great time to prepare for severe weather. Families should practice their severe weather safety plan at home, work, school, or other public locations that they frequent. Everyone should know where to go should severe weather strike his or her location.

Tornadoes are one threat from thunderstorms that we need to be ready for, but there are other hazards that accompany storms. Large hail, damaging winds, and dangerous lightning accompany some of the storms that rumble across Nebraska. Your actions before and during severe weather may save lives.

Watch vs. Warning

A *tornado watch* means conditions are favorable for a tornado in our area.

- Remain alert for approaching storms
- Listen to local radio or TV for updates
- Be prepared to move to shelter

A *tornado warning* means a tornado has been sighted or is indicated by weather radar.

If you're indoors

- Go immediately to the shelter areas
- Stay away from windows and glass
- Stay in the shelter area until the storm has passed and are advised that it is safe to leave.

If you're outside

- If possible, get inside a building at once
- If you can't get to a shelter find a ditch or low-lying area, apply your hands to cover your head
- Be aware of the potential for flying debris and flooding, and stay away from glass, small buildings, and fencing

If you are in a vehicle, get out and into a building, or, if there is time, lie in a ditch or other low-lying area.

Campbell Storm Siren Information

- The Campbell storm sirens are located in the city park and are tested the first

Saturday of each month at approximately 10:00 A.M. If the siren is activated at any other time and the weather looks stormy (even if it is at midnight) it is signaling that cloud rotation has been spotted and you should take the necessary measures to protect yourselves. Seek shelter immediately in a basement or an interior area without windows, such as a bathroom or closet.
