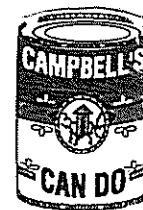

A motion was made by Pearson and seconded by Lang to adopt Resolution No. 19-3 setting the final property tax request for the 2019-2020 budget. Roll call: aye - Lang, Pearson, Skupa, Trambly; nay - 0; absent - L'Heureux. Motion carried. A complete copy of the resolution is on file in the clerk's office.

A motion was made by Skupa and seconded by Trambly to adopt Resolution No. 19-2 (Revised) pertaining to payment of the Water Utility Bond. Roll call: aye - Lang, Pearson, Skupa, Trambly; nay - none; absent - L'Heureux. Motion carried. A complete copy of the resolution is on file in the clerk's office.

**Atrial Fibrillation Screening:**  
 Atrial fibrillation is the most common heart arrhythmia, affecting 2.7 million Americans. Anyone is eligible. Cost \$30.00

To be eligible for the following studies you must be at least 65 years old or age 55 with certain personal risk factors or family history. Please discuss your eligibility with the scheduler listed below.

**Peripheral Arterial Disease Screening:**  
 A painless, non-invasive test called the ankle-brachial index (ABI) compares the blood pressure in the ankles to the blood pressure in the arms to determine how well blood is flowing. Cost is \$20.00

**Abdominal Aortic Ultrasound Screening:**  
 This painless, non-invasive screening detects the presence of an aneurysm on the abdominal aorta (4 hour fast required) Cost is \$40.00

**Carotid Artery Ultrasound Screening:**  
 This painless non-invasive screening detects plaque deposits in the carotid arteries. These plaque deposits are a leading risk factor for stroke. Cost is \$40.00

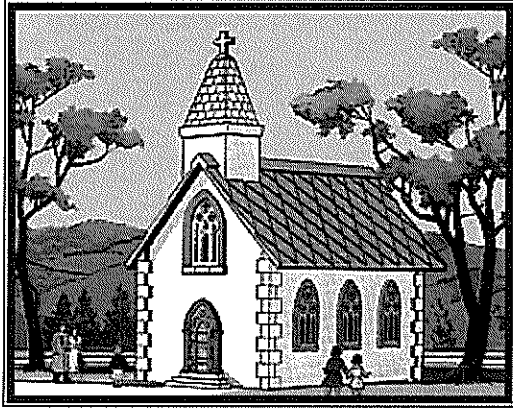
